Over the past few years most New Members joined COSSAR directly into one of our 4 chapters rather than first being an At Large member and then associating with a Chapter. This also presents an opportunity to build a broader base of chapter members who are more familiar with the proper techniques for genealogy research and application preparation. I am working with the chapters to help them develop the local capability to assist prospective new members of their chapter to properly complete their applications.

The National Society SAR recently published 2 new documents on their website that can help such budding enthusiasts with that pursuit:

- 1. SAR Application Preparation Manual
- 2. NSSAR Genealogy Committee Policies

From the Home Page and the Compatriots tab drop down menu, select NSSAR Committees. Click on the link for the Genealogy Committee. At the lower right corner of the page click on the link to the *Genealogy Policies and Application Preparation Manual*. However, you can also go to www.sar.org/Committees/Genealogy/Policies
You will see the "Attachment" links to the manuals at the bottom of the webpage.

When working on new member applications be sure to let them know about the family discount of \$50.00 each that is available for other family who join on the same lineage at the same time. The details are on Page 3 of the annual Membership Directory. A \$20.00 discount is applicable for family Supplemental Applications.

NSSAR Linked to Amazon

Amazon.com is a large online retailer that is quite popular. They have links to a number of suppliers with a wide cross-section of consumer products whereby you can do comparison price shopping right from your home PC.

NSSAR has an agreement with Amazon.com that produces revenue for NSSAR for all your Amazon.com purchases. The revenue we receive goes to the NSSAR General Fund.

From the NSSAR home page you will need to "Login" by clicking on the white "Login" tab on the right side of the screen at about the middle of the Home Page. Then click on the "Compatriots" tab and scroll down to the "Member Services" tab and click on it.

The page you then see will have the Amazon link on it on which you should click. That will take you to the Amazon.com page which further explains the program. You can click on the **AMAZON.COM** link near the bottom of the page.

You will then be on the Home Page of Amazon.com where you can shop 'till you drop. Anything you then purchase from Amazon.com will result in a percentage of the sale being sent to NSSAR which will be added to our General Fund.

If you do some comparison shopping before you start the above process you might find that you can also obtain a small discount. However, this does not always happen so don't be disappointed if your purchase doesn't qualify. At least our NSSAR General Fund will be happier.

C.A.R. and DAR News

On Saturday, 10 March, along with PP Chapter President Dick Marsh, I attended the 64th Annual Colorado C.A.R. State Conference in Colorado Springs. Our Color Guard presented the colors to open their meeting and I Brought Greetings to them from COSSAR. C.A.R. does have our 28 July annual picnic on their planning calendar and are eagerly anticipating additional details about it. I have a list of the new C.A.R. State Officers. The PP SAR Chapter approved a \$100.00 donation to the Pikes Peak C.A.R. Society President's Project. Other chapters are encouraged to support a local C.A.R. Society.

I received updated DAR state and chapter contact info and provided my information to them. The Kinnikinnik Chapter Registrar Dawn Wright gave me a SAR referral. She gets a NSSAR DAR Finder Form when the SAR application is submitted.

I attended a joint meeting of the Zebulon Pike and Kinnikinnik Chapters and the Kinnikinnik Chapter induction ceremony meeting where COSSAR member Dr. Matthew Bowdish (PP) spoke on the "Medical History of George Washington."

National Trustee Update

PG Magerkurth noted \$500,000 in debt was retired. He appointed a 5-man committee to reduce the NSSAR application approval process from 3-4 months down to 6 weeks. Genealogist General Larry Cornwall was appointed as chairman. They are now handling applications within 6 weeks and hope to reduce it further to 4 weeks.

Librarian General Michael Wells encouraged members to become "Friends of the Library" to help purchase needed replacement equipment and defray operating costs. See the brochure form at:

The Bylaws and Resolutions Committee proposed several changes that were approved by the Trustees and will be voted on at the Annual Congress in July.

The Trustees approved a request to enter negotiations to make a 10-year lease of the 4th Street Headquarters building at about \$130-\$140,000/year. Leasing the building rather than selling it may be a better alternative in this down real estate market. They also authorized an engineering/architectural service to update the building for leasing.

Past issues of *The SAR Magazine* had articles on the Spanish contribution to the American Revolution. About 8,500 Spanish Soldiers and Sailors helped protect the Southern flank and the Mississippi River valley from English invasion and Westward expansion. They also helped defend the West Coast from Russian expansion into our NW. Over the past few years the Membership and Genealogy Committees have delved into the Spanish contribution to the American Revolution and have worked to identify the Spanish who were involved in these actions.

PG Magerkurth announced the formation of a new committee dedicated to research, document and make available information on these Spanish Soldiers and Sailors. Ed Karr (CO) was appointed as Chairman and Stephen Renouf (CA) is Vice Chairman. FPG Ed Butler (TX), and author of the magazine articles, is a committee member, among others.

Ed met Spanish Ambassador to the US, Jorge Dezcaller, while both were at a SAR Plaque Dedication Ceremony at the old Governor's Palace in Santa Fe, NM where the Ambassador spoke. Ambassador Dezcaller has since submitted over 560 names of Spanish Soldiers and Sailors who do not appear to be among the records NSSAR previously had on file. The committee hopes to receive many more names.

- **225**th **US Constitution Anniversary** Big plans are in the works for the SAR to celebrate the 225th anniversary of the signing of the US Constitution. To qualify each state society AND the majority of its chapters must present, during the previous year, at least one NSSAR Flag Certificate to a person or organization who qualifies.
